A Reminder About Our Lower Gate and Safe Parking

We kindly remind families that our *lower gate* is only to be used in **exceptional circumstances** and by **prior arrangement.** If you *walk from Buckfastleigh* and require access via this gate, please contact *Ania*, who will keep a list of those families needing to use it.

For the safety of all, we have been advised that families **must not** park on the pull in by the roundabout. This area has **double yellow lines**, and unfortunately, there have been times when so many cars have gathered there that they are extending onto the roundabout itself, creating a hazardous situation. Additionally, some families have been seen crossing the roundabout at its widest point, which is extremely dangerous.

If you **have permission** to collect from the lower gate and are travelling in a vehicle please ensure you park in Buckfast Abbey carpark and use the designated **crossing points** for safety, rather than crossing the main roundabout.

We also ask for your support in understanding that Ania has multiple responsibilities, including managing the school phone and main door, as well as supporting our children. She is unable to oversee the lower gate at all times.

We truly appreciate your cooperation in keeping **all of our children, families, and staff safe.** Thank you for your understanding and support.
