

January has come to an end, and we welcome February with sunshine and glimpses of spring. Last week, we had the pleasure of hosting our RE Advisor, Dawn Potterton, for her first visit to St. Mary's. She was warmly welcomed into our school community and spoke highly of the children's engagement in Religious Education, praising their focus, enthusiasm, and excellent learning behaviours.

It is truly remarkable to see how well our children are embracing the new **Religious Education Directory (RED)**, which has been our RE curriculum since September 2024.
