This form will be stored securely in the school office when not in use. It will be used by staff when taking the children off site to allow them to contact parents / carers if necessary and to ensure permissions are known and abided by. It will be in the care of the senior professional accompanying the children on any such outing. The forms will be kept for one year after which they will be destroyed securely, for example by shredding, with the exception of the images permission sheet which will be kept until permission is withdrawn for use or images are no longer being used, for example, on the website.

Any images will be deleted from cameras as soon as reasonably possible after an event. Any images to be retained will be uploaded on to the school's secure server; a small selection will be uploaded onto the school's website. The digital images will be completely deleted, including from the recycle bin. Any hard copies will be securely destroyed unless contained in work books which are sent home with the pupils when no longer needed in school.
